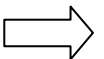
Rules

1. Limit of five students per school in each Latin division in the preliminary round.
2. No limit in the Years 10-11 Greek competition.
3. Students must read from an unmarked copy.
4. On this occasion, schools may come to the prelim. round on 9 June or 11 June, it being understood that no one may come on 11 June except those who would be unable to come on 9 June. There may be different judges on the two prelim. days, although every effort will be made to keep the standard of judging uniform.

Procedure

Please register outside the Kevin Lee room on arrival. Students and their teachers will be directed to the judging rooms, where they may sit in and listen to other readers from their own school if they wish, or wait outside for their turn. Refreshments for teachers will be available during the day.
