BROTHER B.M.DYNES MEMORIAL AWARD

The Brother B.M. Dynes Award is made annually by the Classical Languages Teachers' Association Incorporated (*CLTA Inc.*) as one of a number of initiatives to encourage graduates in Classics to enter the secondary teaching profession. It is currently worth \$1000-00 and is awarded to a senior undergraduate enrolled in Classics at an Australian university.

The Award was instituted in memory of Brother Mark Dynes after his death in 1988. Brother Dynes was an outstanding scholar and teacher of the Classics who won the admiration of both his professional peers and his students - in particular those of St Patrick's College at Strathfield in Sydney where he taught Latin for many years. He was a Christian Brother for 59 years, a medallist in Greek at the University of Sydney, a past President of the Classical Association of New South Wales and a Life Member of the CLTA Inc.

Applications are invited from 3rd or 4th Year undergraduates in Latin or Latin and Greek who intend seeking a career as a secondary school teacher of Classics. The Award is made on the basis of academic record, references, proven interest in teaching and, at the discretion of the Committee, an interview.

Any eligible students with a firm intention to pursue a career in secondary teaching are encouraged to apply by completing and returning the details requested on the Application Form.
