Beginners

Level	Guide to levels	Texts (will be posted mid November)
1A	This is for complete beginners with no prior knowledge of the language. Tutors: Michael Salter and Seumas MacDonald	A beginners' course book will be provided.
1B	This will begin with the basics, and move into simple translation with lots of grammar. For those who have begun Latin but have not progressed very far. Tutors: Joel Morrison and Emma Cole	A course book will be provided.

Starting again

1C	If you did some Latin (or a long time ago!) and want to go back to the beginning, this is the course for you. It will cover grammar and readings. Tutors: Mr Anthony Alexander and Mr Atticus Cox.	A course book will be provided, including: Caesar, <i>de bello Gallico</i> Selections from Ovid and Catullus

Intermediate

2A	This requires some knowledge of Latin grammar which will be developed. Tutors: Damaris Wikramanayake and John Coombs	A wide variety of graded readings will be provided, together with other activities.
2B	This will have greater emphasis on extensive graded readings with prior preparation. Grammar will be revised and extended. You should be familiar with all tenses and cases, but not necessarily passives or subjunctives. Tutors: Tom Atkinson and Nicholas Olsen	A course booklet will be provided with a wide variety of readings.
2C	This will be more challenging than 2B, with plenty of grammar and readings. Tutors: Michelle McVeigh and Sarah Lawrence	A course booklet will be provided.

Intermediate plus

3A	This is designed to widen your reading experience in original Latin (with preparation) and will include work on grammar, interpretation and reading technique. Suitable for yr 11/12 students and undergraduates with one year's Latin. Tutors: (1) Helen Pigram (2) Jane Williams (3) Anne Richardson	You will have three teachers, once each day, and read all three texts: (1) Vergil's Camilla (<i>Aeneid</i> 7, 11) (2) Aristaëus, Orpheus, and Eurydice (<i>Georg.</i> 4, Ovid <i>Met.</i> 10) (3) Cicero <i>In Catilinam</i> 1
3B	This will require a wider range of readings requiring preparation. Grammar will be explained as needed. It is not designed for school students. Tutors: Roger Pitcher and Alison Waters	A Selection of Medieval texts including letters, poems, drama, stories, and excerpts from Bede's <i>Ecclesiastical History</i>

Advanced

4	This level will be reading-based, and texts may be allocated for translation in class. Attention will be paid to literary analysis and grammatical problems. Tutors: Group A (9.30am) (1) Elizabeth Minchin (2) Ian MacLeod (3) Dexter Hoyos Group B (11.15am) (4) Chris Ransom (5) Anne Rogerson	There will be two sessions each day, and participants are to choose two, one from group A and 4X, and one from group B and 4Y. Please indicate a second preference. (a) (1) Lucretius <i>De Rerum Natura</i> (2) Vergil, <i>Georgics</i> 4 (3) Tacitus' <i>Agricola</i> (a) (4) Statius <i>Achilleid</i> (5) Encountering the uncanny in poetry.
4X and Y	Reading-based with more attention given to interpretation than translation. The emphasis will be on matters social, historical, or literary. Discussion encouraged. Tutors: 4X (9.30am) Frances Muecke 4Y (11.15am) Paul Roche	4X or 4Y may be combined with another level four class or taken together. 4X Lyric: Catullus and Beyond 4Y The Bacchanalia of 186BC: Livy 39 and the <i>SC de Bacchanalibus</i> (CIL 1.2.581)
